Pastor Greg's November Message:

Good November All,





Benefit amounts are based on the household's heating costs, household size, and income. The Energy Assistance program provides help with energy disconnections, no/low fuel in the tank, and homeowners' furnace repairs. 
He is preceded in death by his father, Jerry; brother, Mark; and sister-in-law, Sheila.

THE BEGINNING Part 1

"But only God can make a tree"; here in this part of His earth, He had used a most generous hand. The stately white and Norway pine, the scrappy jack pine, the sturdy oak, and beautiful birch seemed almost without end. The serene "sheets" of

water, the marshes, and meadows, and most important - the rivers - the Crow Wing and Long Prairie were all in place and waiting. Through this wonderland of wilderness, the western march of American pioneers and old-world immigrants found its way. They found strong reason to halt for a while, put down some tenuous roots, some soon to be pulled up to move, but some were meant to stay. So, a village was formed, fed by the railroad, the lumber mills, and the farms; fashioned into a trading center with hotels, stores, livery stables, a schoolhouse, a blacksmith shop - our Motley.

The people brought with them not only a pioneering spirit, but the spirit from God which they needed to thank and praise Him. So, congregations were started, and churches built - Catholic, Free Methodist, Methodist and Lutheran. This is the first part of events in the life of the United Methodist Church in Motley. This is dedicated to the memory of those Christians who over a hundred years ago were the charter members and to Rev. H.W. Troy who organized them into a church. Those members were: Mrs. Alfred Wilson, Mary H Ward, Mrs. M.M. Hodge, Mr. & Mrs. John McMillian, and Mr. & Mrs. Samuel Ward.
